ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA is an International Journal of Linguistics. It publishes papers on general linguistics. Papers presenting empirical material must have strong theoretical implications. The scope of the journal is not restricted to the core areas of linguistics; it also covers areas such as socio- and psycholinguistics, neurolinguistics, discourse analysis, the philosophy of language, language typology, and formal semantics. The journal also publishes book and dissertation reviews and advertisements. The journal's language is English.

SUBMISSION

Manuscripts to be published in ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA should be submitted through the *OJS (Open Journal System)*, an online manuscript submission and review system, which can be found at the following url: <http://submit.akademiai.com/aling>.

REVIEW PROCESS

PREFERRED CONDITIONS OF MANUSCRIPTS

ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA strives to publish high quality papers. To ensure this goal, we apply some basic principles when reviewing a manuscript. Not fulfilling these principles may lead to desk rejection of a submitted manuscript. All submissions are pre-screened by the editorial board and only those papers are submitted to the anonymous review procedure which fit the aims and scope of the journal.

All research articles must offer new results, demonstrate that the author is aware of the research findings relevant to the given topic and should make a clear distinction between these and the author's own original research results. Book reviews must contain a critical perspective, including the author's own ideas and opinion, and should address a particular audience.

REVIEW OF THE MANUSCRIPTS

As a routine, each paper will be read by at least two unbiased peer reviewers, chosen avoiding any conflict of interest. In exceptional cases one report may be sufficient. ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA applies a double-blind review process, in which neither the authors' nor the reviewers' identities are revealed.

Unpublished content is treated strictly confidentially.

COPYRIGHT AND LICENCE POLICY

OPEN ACCESS

Authors of ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA can optionally choose (immediate) Open Access appearance. With this choice, readers can read, download, copy, distribute, print, search or link to the full texts of articles, or use them for any other non-commercial lawful purpose. Such articles are distributed under Creative Commons Attribution-NonCommercial 4.0 International Licenses.

Authors not choosing Open Access publication are expected to sign the Copyright Transfer Form available [here](#).

SELF-ARCHIVING

The Author is entitled to self-archive the preprint version of his/her manuscript. The preprint version is the Author's manuscript or the galley proof or the Author's manuscript along with the corrections made in the course

of the peer review process. The Author's right to self-archive is irrespective of the format of the preprint (.doc, .txt, .pdf) version and self-archiving includes the free circulation of this file via email or publication of this preprint on the Author's webpage or on the Author's institutional repository with open or restricted access. When self-archiving a paper, the Author should clearly declare that the archived file is not the final published version of the paper, he/she should quote the correct citation and enclose a link to the published paper ([http://dx.doi.org/\[DOI of the Article without brackets\]](http://dx.doi.org/[DOI of the Article without brackets])).

AUTHOR CHARGES

If choosing the optional Open Access appearance, the corresponding author of every manuscript submitted after Feb 1, 2020 is requested to pay the *Article Processing Charge* (APC) of 900 EUR (including VAT) to cover the publishing costs of the paper.

In accordance with the agreement between the [Electronic Information Service National Programme](#) (EISZ) and Akadémiai Kiadó, papers with a corresponding author affiliated to a member institution subscribing to the journal package of Akadémiai Kiadó, can be published with no fee.

Akadémiai Kiadó offers 50% discount for Editorial Board members, and institutions of low- and middle-income countries. Discounts may not be combined. A limited number of waivers is available.

Manuscripts with outstanding payment will not be published until the balance is cleared. Once your paper is accepted for publication in ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA, and the Authors made the Open Access choice, you will be requested to enter our online payment platform (<http://apc.akademiai.hu>), where after registration You can upload the license agreement and transfer the fee. Article processing will commence after the amount due has been remitted to our account. (Please note that there is no peer review charge, the only applicable fee is the article processing charge for authors of accepted papers who made the OA choice.)

ETHICAL STATEMENT

ACTA LINGUISTICA ACADEMICA and Akadémiai Kiadó are committed to the ethical practices in science publishing and therefore follow the COPE [Code of Conduct for Journal Editors](#) as well as the [Code of Conduct for Journal Publishers](#). PREPARATION OF THE MANUSCRIPTS

After a paper has been accepted for publication, the finalised files can be submitted for typesetting in doc format (e.g., Word, OpenOffice Writer, etc.) or standard LaTeX. In addition to the source files, please *also* send the pdf version of your final manuscript. If other word processing software is used, let this software create a **doc** or **LaTeX** conversion and submit these together with the original source files. **LaTeX** users are requested to send *all* their original source files (**tex**, **sty**, **bib** etc.) and the **pdf** version.

COVER PAGE

A cover page must be submitted together with each manuscript, as a separate file.

The following information should be provided on the cover page of the manuscript: the *title* of the article (or, in case of reviews, the title of the book under discussion, the name of the publisher, the place and date of publication as well as the number of pages), the *author's full name, affiliation, email address*.

KEYWORDS AND ABSTRACT

The manuscript should be accompanied by a list of *five keywords* and an *abstract* of about *100 words*.

TABLES AND FIGURES

Tables and figures should be numbered consecutively and provided with concise captions. Please indicate the preferred position of the table or figure in the text by inserting a line "Insert figure XX around here". Please bear in mind that all tables and figures eventually have to fit the following text area, either portrait or landscape: *124 mm × 180 mm*. Font size of tables/figures: *9 pts*. As a default, the paper will be printed in black & white. Printed colour illustrations are possible for an extra charge of 40 EUR (or 10 000 HUF) + VAT per picture. Please make sure any illustrations are still meaningful when printed in black & white. Graphics should be supplied in electronic form or as a clean, high-quality hard copy to enable scanning if necessary. We accept the following graphics file formats: **EPS, JPG, PSD, TIFF**. These files must have a final resolution of at least *300 dpi*. *All graphics files must be submitted separately from the document file*. Carefully check all graphics for errors before submission as the typesetter often cannot make corrections in these electronic files.

Reference to a publication should be made by the name of the author, the year of publication and, when necessary, by page numbers in the following ways:

- ...as described by Schmidt (1967)... ...as described in Durand & Katamba (1995)...
- ...as referred to by Hoover (1967, 56–78; 1976, 43) and in Kaye et al. (1990)...
- ...mentioned by several authors (Elgar 1978, 77; Williams 1981, 154–156)...

An alphabetically arranged *list of references* should be presented at the end of the article according to the linguistic Society unified style sheet (https://www.linguisticsociety.org/sites/default/files/style-sheet_0.pdf). All first names of authors are to be written out in full (first names of editors can be abbreviated):

Description

For marking subsections decimal notation should be applied. Do not use more than four digits if possible. Citations in the text should be enclosed in double quotation marks (" "). Examples within the text should be marked in italics. Meanings are to be rendered between inverted commas (' '). Glosses are to be given morpheme by morpheme; the initial letter of the gloss should be placed exactly below that of the example. Conventions for such interlinear glosses should follow the "*Leipzig Glossing Rules*", for details, check out <http://www.eva.mpg.de/lingua/resources/glossing-rules.php>; for an example, see (1a) below:

- (1) a. A sólymaid elszálltak.
 the falcon-POSS-PL-2SG fly-PST-3PL
 'Your falcons have flown away.'

Examples can be referred to in the text as (1a), (1a–d), etc. Phonological/phonetic transcriptions are to be given in the same font as the main text and are best entered as unicode.

PROOF

Online page proofs for Author's approval or corrections are requested to be returned within 48 hours from receipt. Please note that Authors are urged to check their proofs carefully before submitting corrections, since late corrections cannot be guaranteed for inclusion and post-publication corrections are only possible in an erratum. Corrections to the proofs must be restricted to existing errors. Rewriting the text or modifying authorship is not accepted in the proof stage.
