Papers shall be written in concise English. Contributors who are not native English speakers are advised to get their manuscript checked by a native English-speaking colleague prior to submission. Papers – including a short summary, tables, figures and list of references – should not exceed 16 pages (Margins: 5 cm upper, 5.5 cm lower, 4 cm left, 4.5 cm right; single space; Font type: Times New Roman (text 10.5 pt, tables and figure captions 9.5 pt). Lines should be numbered to facilitate the review process. The content of this guide contains information on the submission of manuscripts and the review and communication process. At the same time, its format and structure follow the format and structure of the manuscripts.

## Material and methods

For the sake of uniformity, papers of type a) should as far as possible conform to the following outline:

- 68 a) Abstract/Summary (at most one typed page, giving a concise description of the  
69 problem studied, the methods applied, the results achieved and the conclusions  
70 drawn from them). After the Summary, please define up to 5 keywords.  
71 b) Introduction (grounds for the research, brief survey of literature);  
72 c) Material and methods.  
73 d) Results.  
74 e) Discussion and conclusion  
75 The construction of papers of type b) – d) will depend on the subject matter.

### 77 **Results**

78  
79 Experimental results can be presented either in tables or in figures, but the same  
80 data must not be included in both. *The number of tables and figures should not exceed*  
81 *3–4*. Tables and figures should be inserted at the end of the manuscript. In case of  
82 large size, they can be submitted in a separate file. At the final layout, they will be  
83 placed in the correct position.

84 Each table must be numbered and supplied with a title. Care should be taken to  
85 ensure that dimensions are indicated accurately using internationally accepted units.  
86 Please avoid overloading the tables, so only the most important data should be  
87 included, please also limit the numbers after the decimal point.

### 89 **Discussion**

90  
91 Photographs and illustrations (max. 3–4) should be marked as “Figure” and  
92 numbered consecutively. Attention must be paid to the quality of the photographs  
93 (sharpness, contrast), as well as to the clarity, accuracy and careful execution of the  
94 drawings. Diagrams should be clear and accurate. The title and legend of the figure  
95 should be included in the list of figures. The diagrams should contain as little text as  
96 possible; the various parts of compound figures should be designated with capital  
97 letters, and lower-case letters should be used within each figure (e.g. to distinguish  
98 individual curves). The explanation of these letters should be contained in the caption.  
99 The size of the tables and figures should not exceed 12.5 x 18.5 cm. In online papers,  
100 images and graphs appear in color.

### 102 **Conclusion**

103  
104 The manuscript submission system allows for double blind review, i.e. neither  
105 the reviewers know the identity of the author(s) nor the author(s) of the reviewers.  
106 When submitting the manuscript, the author(s) may propose the reviewers, who  
107 should in any case be recognized scientist in the subject of the manuscript and inde-  
108 pendent of the author(s). The reviewing process of the submitted manuscript is coord-  
109 inated by the relevant section editor. The communication of the submitted manu-  
110 scripts is proposed by the section editor based on the opinion of at least two review-  
111 ers. In case of dissenting opinions, the section editor calls for additional reviewer(s).

112 The Editorial Board and the Editor-in-Chief decide on the acceptance of the submit-  
113 ted papers based on the opinion of the reviewers and the section editor.

114 The authors receive feedback from the reviewer on the form of review sheet.  
115 Reviewers can make corrections in the submitted article, if necessary. Indicate the  
116 corrections of errors, deficiencies or other remarks in a traceable manner (e.g. turning  
117 on Review/Track changes, or highlighting the corrected pieces of text). Regardless  
118 of the corrections made in the article, authors should **respond to the opinion of the**  
119 **reviewers in a separate file**. Failing to do this, the manuscript will be automatically  
120 rejected.

121 The author(s) will receive a camera-ready proof of the final-form articles to be  
122 published. Please send it back with your corrections to the Editorial Board within 72  
123 hours.

124 The authors are responsible for the content of the papers. By submitting the  
125 manuscript, the author(s) will automatically declare that they have read and accepted  
126 the [Ethical Guidelines](#) of the Akadémiai Kiadó.

## References

A *list of references* should be included at the end of the paper, in alphabetical order of all author(s) or editor(s) (avoid the use of *et al.*). In the text, refer to the *list* with the first author's Name included within or after the sentence, followed by the year of publication in brackets. For example: ALLEN, et al. (1998) stated... or after the sentence: (ALLEN, et al. 1998). If several articles published by the same author in the same year are cited, these should be distinguished by lower-case letters written after the year. When compiling the list of references, the following guidelines should be adhered to:

- a) In the case of *papers appearing in journals*, the name(s) of the author(s), the year of publication, the title of the paper, the name of the journal, the volume number (in bold), in certain cases the issue number (in brackets) and the first and last page numbers of the paper must be included.
- b) In the case of *books* the reference should include the name(s) of the author(s) or editor(s), the year of publication, the title of the book, the publisher and the place of publication.
- c) In the case of *book sections*, the name of the author of the section, the year of publication of the book, the title of the section and the data listed in point c) for the book must be supplied.
- d) *Verbal communications* need not be listed, while in the case of *manuscripts*, only the author, the year and the title need be designated.


