

## GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

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### **Submission**

Authors should submit their manuscripts online, via <http://submit.akademiai.com/ceugeol>.

### **Manuscript requirements**

#### **I. General requirements**

Owing to the on-line publication, there is no page limit.

The text should be double spaced, written using 12pt Times New Roman and continuous line numbering should be used and the pages numbered.

The text should be formulated using passive voice.

No Cover letter is required, but during the submission in Step 1. Starting the Submission/Comments for the Editor box the name and affiliation and full contact details of at least three potential reviewers is required. It is highly suggested, that at least one of the potential reviewers is from abroad.

### **Manuscript requirements**

The title page should include:

- the title of the paper (with lower-case letters)
- the full name of the authors, corresponding author marked with an ‘\*’
- affiliation of the authors ( name of the institution and city where the work was prepared)
- abstract (length, maximum 300 words)
- a list of five to ten keywords in alphabetical order
- a footnote with the full contact details of the corresponding author

### References

Authors should follow the following reference formats:

## Figures and tables

Figures and tables should be referred to in the text. Figures and photos should be attached in electronic format, and can be in any of the following extension formats: \*.eps, \*.tif, or \*.jpg. Use a resolution of 300 dpi as a minimum. Figures should be clear line drawings or good quality black-and-white photographic prints. Colour photographs will also be accepted. Tables should be provided on separate sheets with a number.

## The manuscript should be organized as:

*Introduction:* stating your motivation and background, why is your study current and interesting; it ends with the aims of the research.

*Materials and Methods*

*Results:* where you present your results.

*Discussion:* Where you compare your results to the ones in literature, this way explicitly placing it in a scientific context and highlighting the novelties of your paper. This is essential so that the readers could place your work in an international context.

*Conclusions:* What are the implications of your answer, what is the main message of your work. Acknowledgements (if required) and References.

Section headings are bold and italic, subheadings are italic. The sections and subsections are not numbered. All lines should be continuously numbered.

The SI (System International) should be used for all units of measurements. References should be embedded in the text without numbering. Any reference style can be used for the submission, provided that the use is consistent throughout the manuscript.

Figures with sufficient resolution should be placed in the text at the relevant points. Tables should be placed at the end of the manuscript.

Supplementary material should be submitted as one file. If several files are submitted then they should be archived in a compressed (e.g. zip or rar) file.

## **II. Revised manuscript**

The revision should contain the following:

**(i) the Revision letter** to the editor providing detailed responses to each of the reviewers’ comments and describing the changes made referring to the lines in the revised manuscript where the change was made.

For example:

**This is a case study, therefore I recommend a sentence to the aims about the importance of the topic for the international readership.**

AGREE AND CHANGES MADE (lines 88-91), a sentence has been added referring to the spatial extension of the implication of the results in the Carpathian Basin (8 countries involved).

**There is no information about spatial correlation structure of the SGW wells (referring to Fig. 7).**

NO CHANGES MADE: The parameters of the variogram are presented in the caption of Fig. 7. These are considered to be enough for the reader to get an idea of the function that was used to provide the weights when kriging was used to produce the map. Since the paper is not a geostatistical study we would not like to get deeper into this question.

**(ii) the revised manuscript**

**(iii) the revised manuscript with track changes**, so the modification can more easily be followed.

In the revision stage, the figures and tables should be submitted separately archived into a single zip or rar file along with the potential supplementary files as well.

### **Proofs and offprints**

The authors will be sent a set of proofs. Each of the pages should be proofread and approved within 72 hours of receipt.
